A minimal to mild degree of fibrosis was noted in 22% of the animals at $4~\text{mg/m}^3$, and a mild to moderate degree of fibrosis was observed in 92% of the animals at $16~\text{mg/m}^3$. These findings are attributed to "lung overloading", a generic response to excessive amounts of any dust retained in the lung for a prolonged interval.
